MINUTES

Friends gathered at 9 a.m. in worship.

Bill Carlie welcomed Friends. Following introductions and announcements, those present in person then met in committees.

The agenda was reviewed. Bill added clerk's report towards the end.

Susan Wade reported as yearly meeting secretary. She read from her report (attached). Friends accepted the report with gratitude.

Friends introduced themselves.

Ed Lesnick reported for Nominating Committee. There are no changes to the committee's report since yearly meeting gathering. The report is attached. Cece Yocum again asks for a new clerk for Youth Committee.

Friends accepted the report.

Kody Hersh reported as the Youth and Young Adult Coordinator. His report is attached. There is a lot happening, and it is controlled chaos! He requests that two more members be appointed to the *ad hoc* Abuse Prevention Committee. The clerk will appoint additional member to the *ad hoc* committee. Friends mentioned that it is supportive for young people, especially those that identify as LGBTQ, to add pronouns to nametags. Kody expanded a little on his mention of his proposal that SEYM work on a longer term plan for Youth & Young Adult work. Friends accepted the report.

A question was raised about apportionment. Phoebe Andersen is still planning to circulate a report.

Cece Yocum spoke for Peace & Social Concerns. There is no response. The committee has discussed responses to gun violence. They have also discussed upcoming elections. Friends accepted the report.

Jan Dahm reported for Worship & Ministry (attached). She emphasized the work to make our spiritual life deeper.

Friends accepted the report.

The clerk will forward a declaration from the Towards Right Relationship with Native People (a part of Friends Peace Teams) which includes a request for an examination of our yearly meeting's involvement in or profit from Indian Boarding Schools to the Committee for Ministry on Racism.

Vicki Carlie reported for Gathering Committee. The committee is contacting a speaker. The dates will be April 5-9, 2023, at Warren Willis Camp (formerly the Life Enrichment Center). Friends accepted the report.

Brian Olsen reported for Half Yearly Meeting. There may be an issue with location. There is no additional report.

Phoebe Andersen reported for Archives Committee. They committee plans to meet at the end of July at the University of Florida to continue work on the archives. Friends accepted the report.

Phoebe Andersen responded to a question about the Publications Committee. They plan to meet soon.

Bill Carlie reported as the clerk. The clerk would like to reach out to St. Petersburg Meeting to host Fall Interim Business Meeting. Friends agreed. Friends wish to continue hybrid meetings. Bill requested that Friends approve a small committee to complete personnel evaluations. Questions were raised about the gender division of the small committee and the personnel.

Youth and Young Adult Coordinator

SEYM Summer Executive Committee Meeting 18 Sixth Month 2022

Dear Friends,

As I complete my time in the SEYM Youth and Young Adult Coordinator role, there is still lots to do, and so many exciting things to report! We had a small but wonderful young adult retreat in St. Petersburg at the beginning of the month—I am including a photo below. It was a real joy to have a group that spanned the whole young adult age range, 18-35. The group included seekers, convinced Friends, and several people who grew up Quaker.



SEYM Youth Committee is sponsoring a van to take youth and young adults from Orlando to the FGC Youth and Young Adults Gathering in Radford, Virginia at the beginning of July— we've filled a minivan, and I know of at least two other SEYM young adults who are coming, but making separate travel arrangements. We've opened registration for our end-of-summer Youth and Families Retreat, and look forward to welcoming Friends at Camp Chowenwaw, just south of Jacksonville, July 21-24. I have attached the event flyer at the end of my report. Please try to think of a family or two connected to your monthly meeting or worship group who you could share it with right now, even (maybe especially!) if you haven't seen them for a while.

I am struggling to find time to complete revisions of our Child Abuse Prevention Program manual, but am optimistic about completing a draft before my role ends in mid-August.

Similarly, it has been challenging to find time and energy for convening the ad hoc Abuse Prevention and Response Committee. I hope we will be able to meet at least once more before my August departure. Given my move, and another committee member no longer being available to serve, I recommend that EC appoint two more members to the committee, including someone who might be willing to assist Cheryl Demers-Holton as a co- or assistant clerk.

As this will be my last report in my role as Youth and Young Adult Coordinator, I would like to take the opportunity to lift up a few key learnings, advices, and observations to Friends.

- 1. A huge percentage of our SEYM youth and young adult participants identify as LGBTQIA+, including a significant number of trans and non-binary individuals. Our youth and young adult groups also include a higher proportion of People of Color compared to SEYM's older adult population. In general, Gen Z and Millenials often have pretty high standards for how groups they are part of demonstrate a commitment to intersectional anti-oppression work. Our ability to effectively support and include these age cohorts and the individuals within them, and benefit from their gifts in community, is directly related to how actively and rigorously we apply ourselves, as a whole SEYM community, to continued growth in our anti-racism, queer and trans affirmation, and every other area of justice and inclusion.
- 2. SEYM doesn't currently have the resources or infrastructure to support a staff position focusing on children, youth, families, and young adults. Raising the money to support my position has been challenging, even at a significantly lower cost than might otherwise be true (given that Orlando Meeting donated my residence so that I could be paid less, at my request). Youth Committee in its current condition doesn't really have the capacity to supervise a staff worker. If I hadn't already known SEYM well coming into the job, and had the tools to figure things out as I went, it's unclear to me that I would have been able to be effective in the position. That doesn't mean we don't need a staff person with specific care for youth, families, and young adults. As staff, I've been able to provide continuity, personnel capacity to try out new things, and pastoral care and connection for young adults and for parents in between events. I believe, and have been told by others, that it makes a big difference to have a dedicated person in this staff role. I encourage you to consider what it might look like to create a five or ten year plan focused on building the capacity to support a permanent staff role in SEYM for support of younger generations.
- 3. There is a lot of work still to do to get our policies and procedures for general harassment and abuse prevention and response, and child safety, where they need to be. Doing this well will require ongoing, focused attention, *forever*. I encourage Friends to consider how best to support this as ongoing work, and be prepared as Executive Committee to materially and structurally support whatever models are discerned: whether a designated volunteer position, a standing committee, or some other structure. Simultaneous to my work with SEYM, I've been serving in a volunteer role for Community Peacemaker Teams (CPT, formerly Christian Peacemaker Teams) as Ombuds, coordinating implementation of that organization's harassment policy and the response process for any reports of harassment that are received. I have seen that model work well, and would be happy to discuss my experience in the role with SEYM Friends at any time.

It has truly been a joy to get to serve this community, and in particular to work with SEYM youth, young adults, and families, the past few years. I am grateful and excited to continue some parts of the work in a contracted capacity, to continue my connection with all of you, and to work together for the creation of a vital, energized, and transformed Southeastern Yearly Meeting and Religious Society of Friends.
